Course Description :

This course examines the involvement of juveniles in delinquency, crime, and law violation based on biological, psychological, legal, particularly sociological explanation, as well as contextual within Indonesia. The definition of the juvenile in this course is based on the Convention on the Rights of The Child and Indonesian Law on Child Protection, which refers to a human being below the age of eighteen. The course views that the involvement of juveniles in delinquency is the state, community, and family failure in taking responsibility to protect the children's rights and child protection itself. The juveniles involved in delinquency should be seen as victims instead of deviants or criminals.
